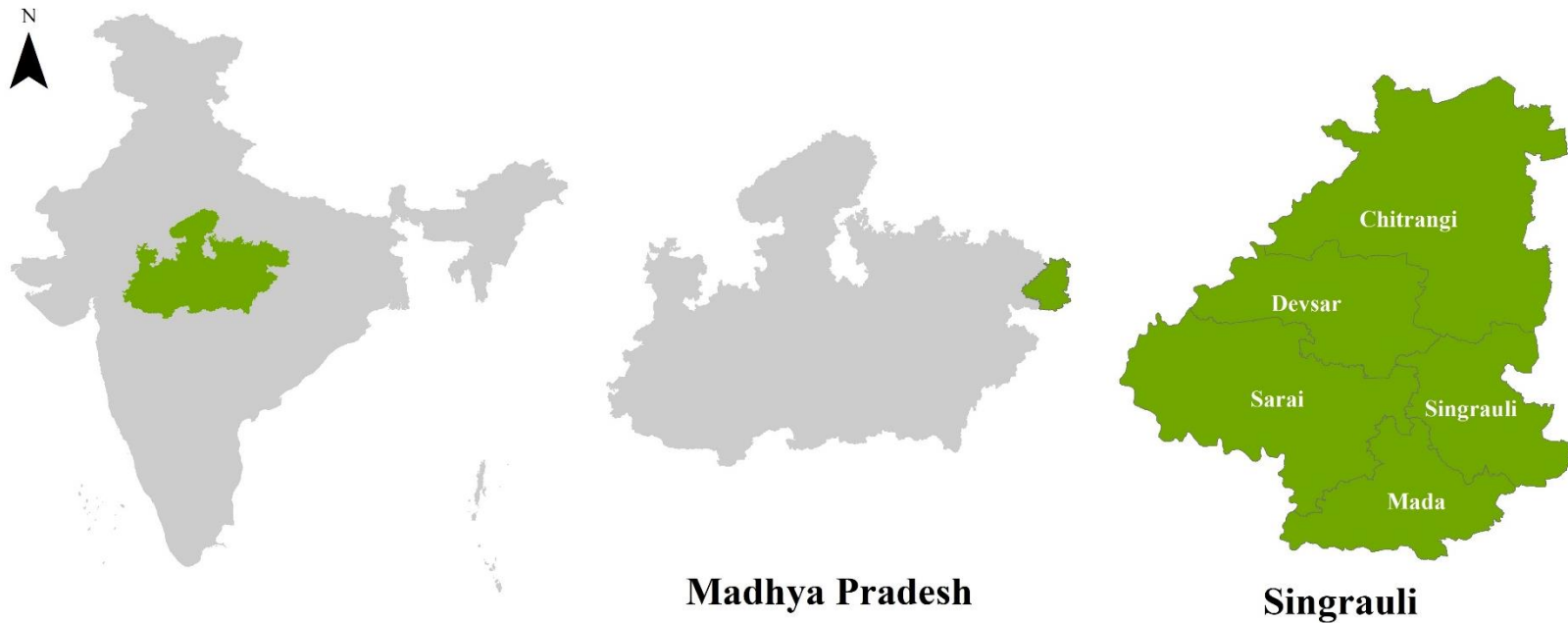


Figure 1: Location of Singrauli district in Madhya Pradesh

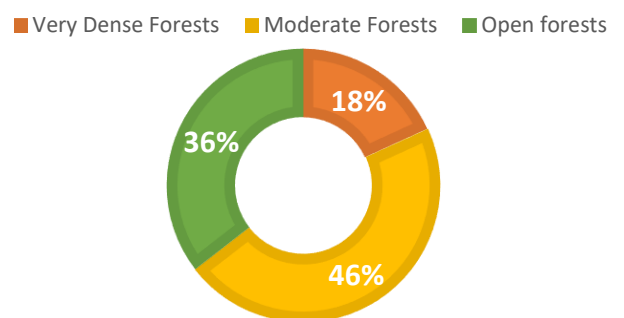


Figure 2: Forest Cover in Singrauli

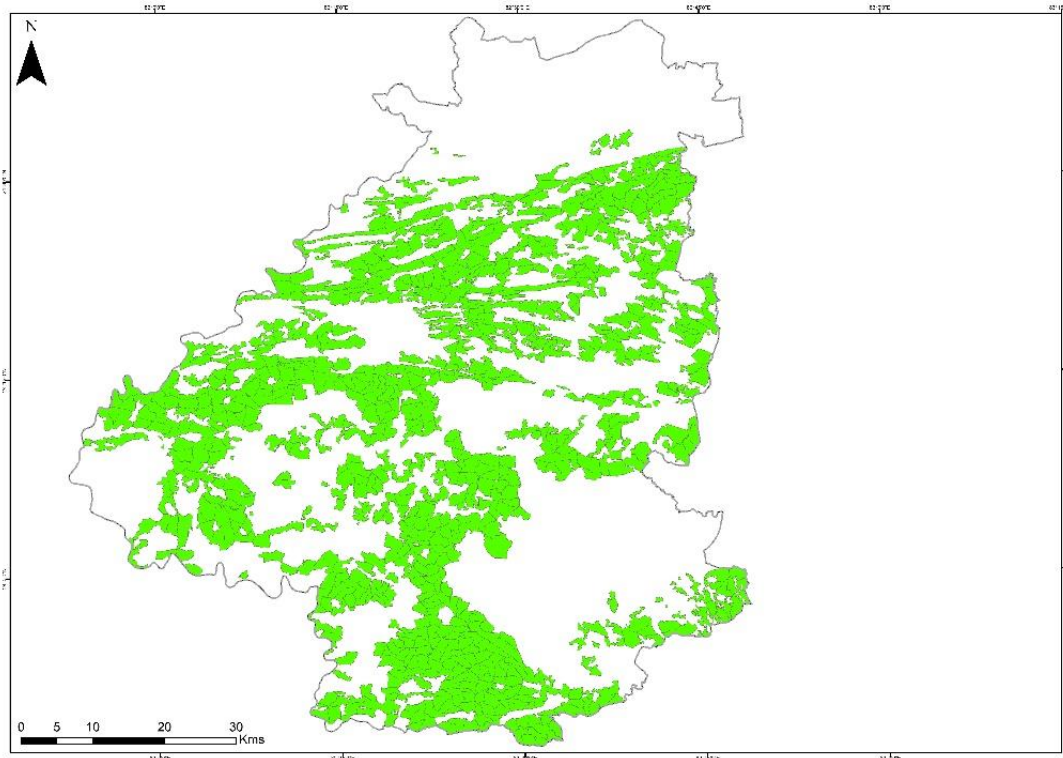


Figure 3: Forest area in the Singrauli district

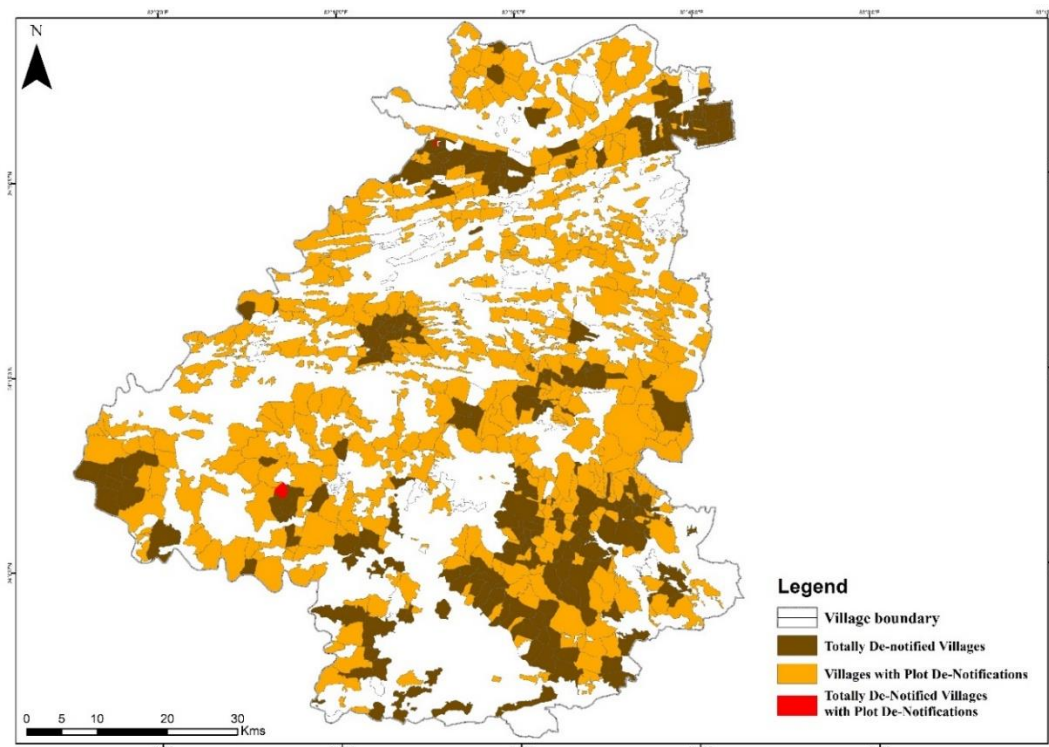


Figure 4: Totally de-notified villages and villages with plot de-notification in Singrauli
